Created case classifications and attributes for all interviewees. Information is organized as follows:

- Person
 - Age group
 - Gender
 - Country
 - Education level
 - TRC involvement

Major themes and discussions from the interviews:

- TRC
 - TRC had good intentions but did not do enough (n=4)
 - Needed to be longer and reach out to the smaller villages and towns (n=2)
 - Victims needed continued support from the commission (n=2)
 - Inclusive of gender, victims, and perpetrators (n=4)
 - BUT men dominated the hearings (n=1)
 - Few perpetrators took part (n=1)
 - Government has not implemented the reports recommendations (n=5)
 - Victims need the reparations recommended and are hurting without them (n=3)
 - Need to implement the war crimes court (n=2)
 - Hope that the TRC would help victim-perpetrators reintegrate into society and get training but it did not (n=1)
 - Should have continued or completed follow-ups (n=2)
 - Issues addressed (e.g., lists of perpetrators and victims, causes of the war, reparations etc.) (n=4)
- Justice
 - Lists of perpetrators and victims a step towards justice (n=3)
 - TRC did not bring total justice because its recommendations have not been implemented (n=4)
 - BUT recommendations show there could be justice in the future (n=1)
 - Perpetrators need to be punished (n=1)
 - Victims suffer while perpetrators have normal lives (n=3)

- Some justice – people discussing what happened to them and who hurt them (n=2)
- Perpetrators
 - Some have been celebrated which hurts victims (n=2)
 - In government roles and preventing TRC recommendations being implemented (n=1)
- Reconciliation
 - TRC did not bring reconciliation (n=2)
 - Recommendations that could bring peace but until implemented not real (n=3)
 - Victim-perpetrators have not been able to reintegrate into society (n=1)
- Victims
 - Had hope for TRC and it let them down (n=4)
 - No protections for the people who spoke at hearings putting them at risk (n=2)
 - Need counselling (n=1)

Code Book for the Liberia Interviews

The following chart breakdowns the codes and child nodes used for coding the Liberia interviews.

Name	Description
Commission	Discussions or references to the TRC e.g., why it was made, opinions on, issues addressed, etc.
Inclusivity	References or discussions of TRC inclusivity or efforts to be inclusive.
Issues Addressed	References or discussions of issues addressed by the TRC.
Mandate	References or discussions of the TRC's mandate.
Opinion of	References or discussions of the interviewees' opinion of the TRC.
Recommendations	References or discussions of the TRC recommendations.
Relationship to	References or discussions of the interviewees' relationship to and/or involvement in the TRC.
Counselling	References or discussions of counselling.
Forgiveness	References or discussions of forgiveness or forgiving.
Justice	References or discussions of justice.
Perpetrators	References or discussions of perpetrators.
Reconciliation	References or discussions of reconciliation.
Truth	References or discussions of truth.
Victims	References or discussions of victims.
Women	References or discussions of women.

The most referenced themes in the interviews were:

- the commission,
- victim, and,
- reconciliation.

*It is unsurprising that discussions of the truth commission were prominent as most of the interview questions were about the truth commission (e.g., its origins, mandate, etc.).

The least referenced themes in the interviews were:

- truth,
- forgiveness, and,
- counselling.

Data Visualizations

This section contains all data visualization for the Liberia interviews. Data visualizations include:

- Word Frequency Clouds - a visual way to show the top 30 words including stems in the interview transcript. More frequently occurring words appear in larger fonts and less frequently appearing words in progressively smaller fonts
- Hierarchy Coding Charts – a diagram that shows hierarchical data as a set of nested rectangles of varying sizes. Here it is used to represent to demonstrate the most to least reference themes in the interview coding. References are scaled by rectangle size – the bigger the rectangle the more references it has compared to smaller rectangles.
- Matrix Coding Charts – chart that can compare what different demographic groups said about an experience, an attitude, or an issue. Data can help reveal coding intersections between individuals.
- Project Maps – a visual way of presenting project data. Can be used to show connections, gaps, and divergences in data.

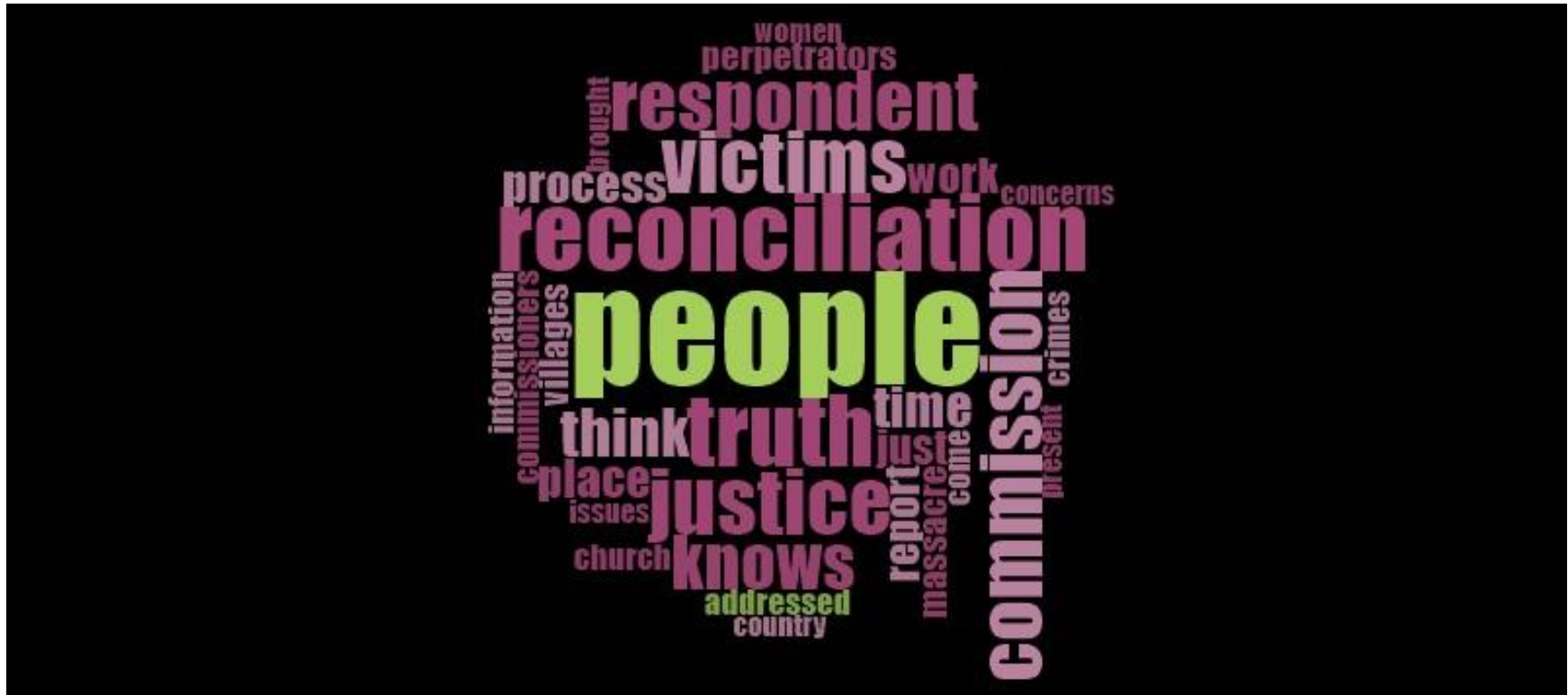

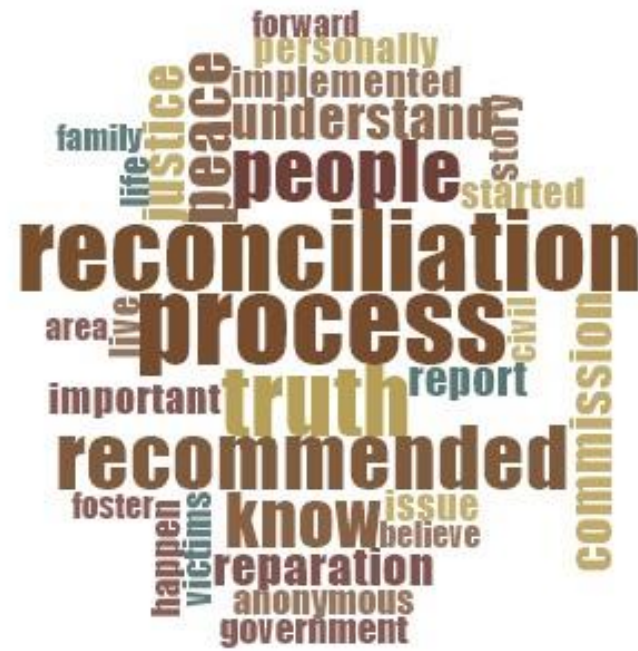

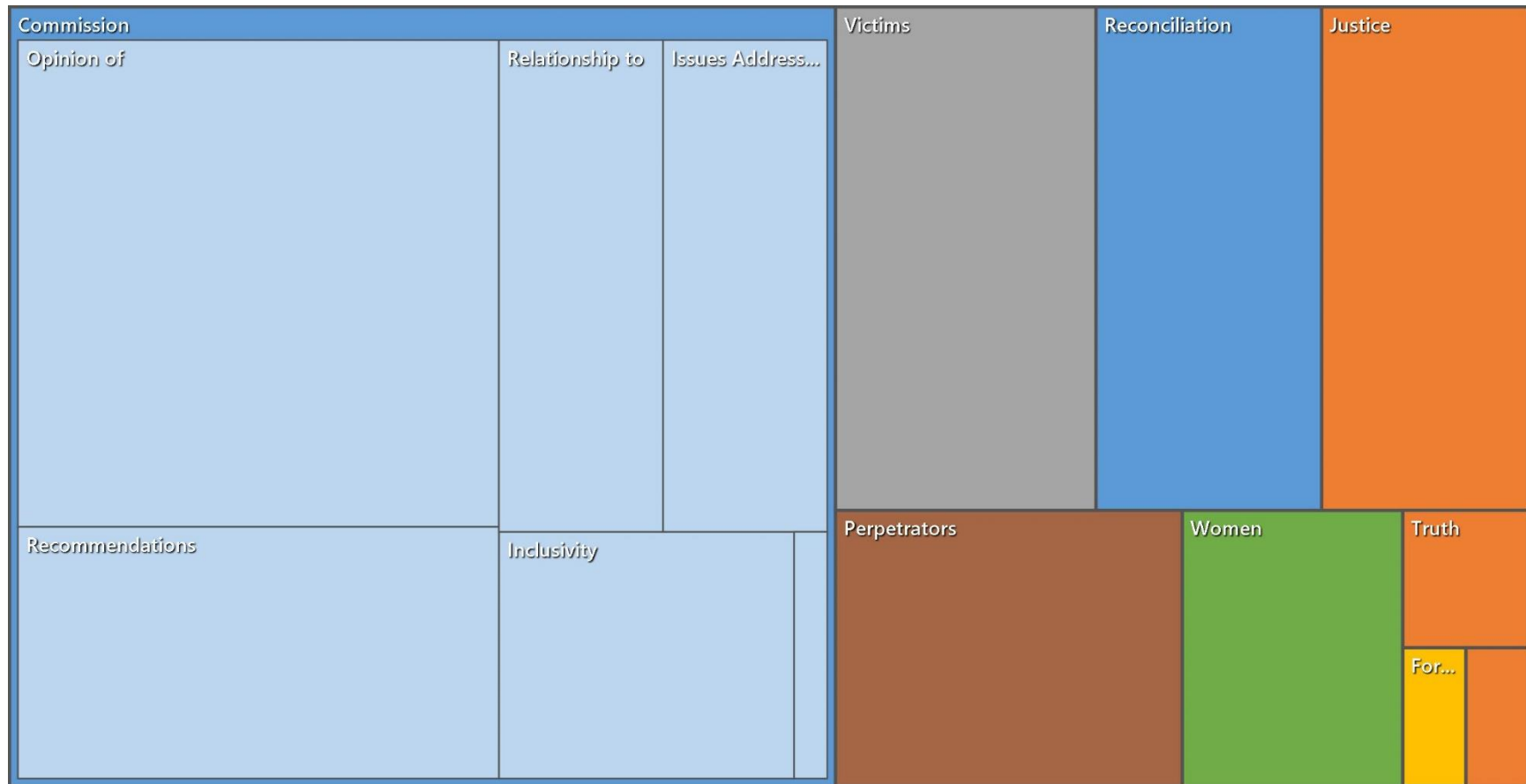

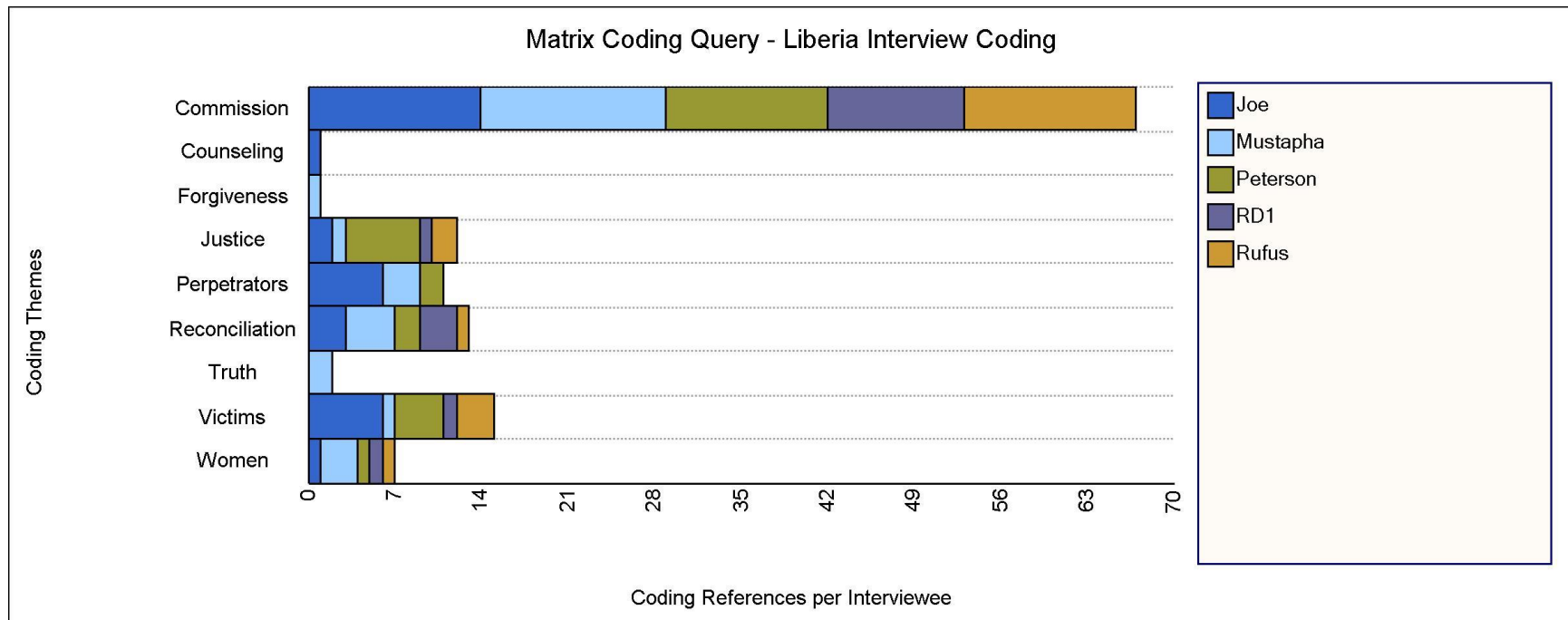

Matrix Coding Query - Liberia Interview Coding

The following chart provides a breakdown of the number of coding references per interviewee (n=5). The y-axis represents the coding themes, and the x-axis represents the number of references the interviewees made to those themes during their interviews. The chart shows that the interviewees referenced the commission, victims, and reconciliation the most in their interviews. The least discussed themes of the interviews were truth, forgiveness, and counselling.

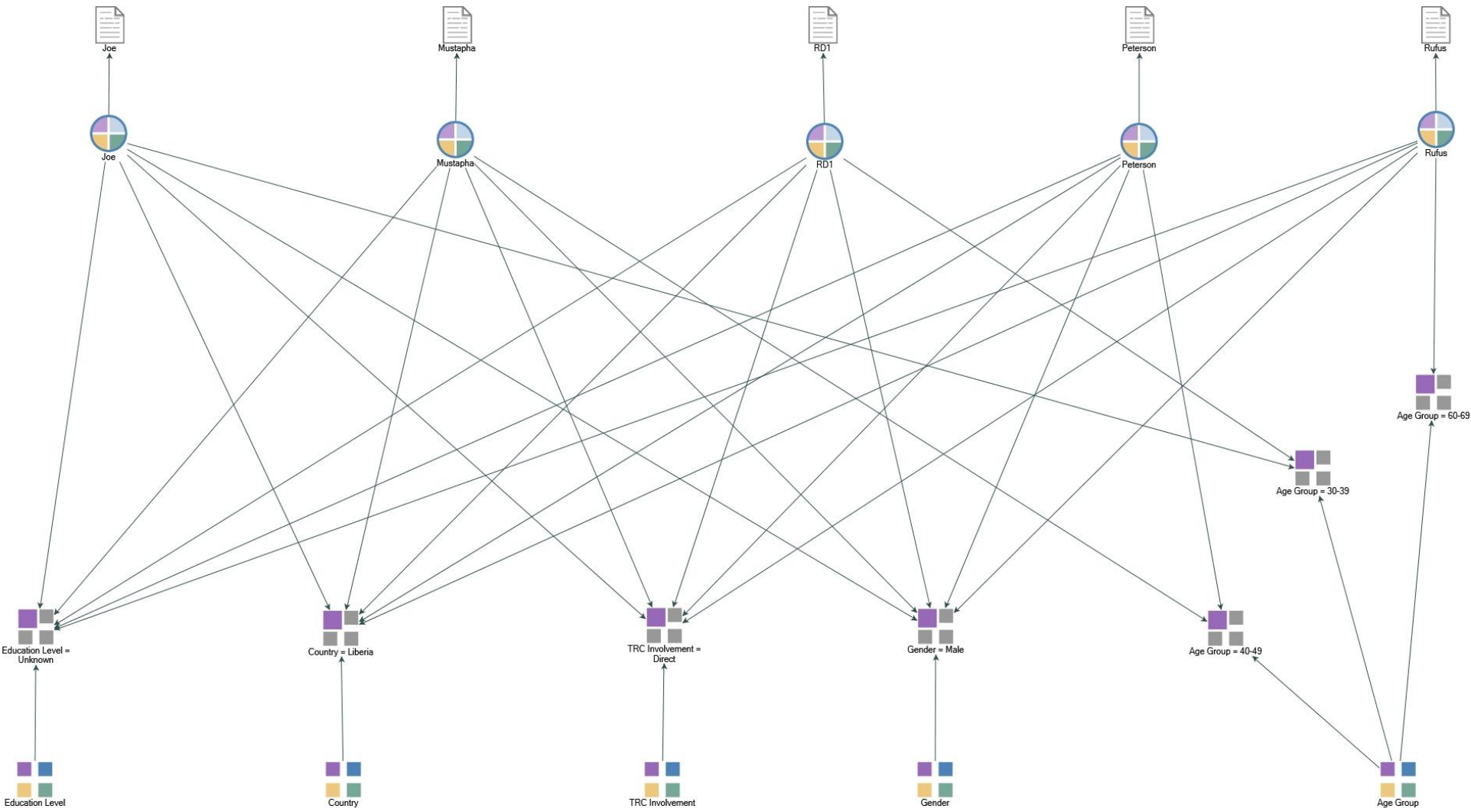
