#### Chart 1: References to Colonialism, Colonial, and Imperialism in the Truth Commission Reports

The following chart provides a breakdown of the number of broad references to colonialism, colonial, and imperialism in the truth commissions analyzed for this report. The y-axis represents the number of references to colonialism, colonial, and imperialism, and the x-axis represents the truth commission reports. The data sets from left to right read the most to the least references to colonialism, colonial, and imperialism. The chart shows that the reports for Timor-Leste, Sierra Leone, and Ghana make the most references to colonialism, colonial, and imperialism, and that the reports for Indonesia, South Korea, and Guatemala make the least references to colonialism, colonial, and imperialism. The Chile report made 0 references to colonialism, colonial, and imperialism.

This chart only includes references to colonialism, colonial, and imperialism in the content of the truth commission reports. References to colonialism, colonial, and imperialism in bibliographies, notes, or chapter headers were not included as they had no bearing on discussions of colonialism, colonial, and imperialism in the report and often skewed the number of references to in the report.
